WATER CONSERVATION

We love green lawns, but we love staying hydrated even more. Please consider a voluntary cut-back on water usage so we don't have to impose restrictions later on. Here are a few Water wise ideas we found...

Water efficiently: No lawn in any season needs daily watering. Specialists recommend 3X per week. (For those with timers: one to four minutes per time, 3 or 4 times each watering day.)

Adjust watering seasonally: Turn sprinklers off or down during cool spells and when raining.

Maintain sprinklers: Broken heads and pipes can waste water. Water lawns and flowers separately for most efficient coverage.

Cut grass higher: Longer blades hold the water in the soil & reduce lawn stress.

Leave grass clippings in place: Use a mulch mower and let the clippings restore nitrogen naturally.

SEWER RATES

City Council approved a monthly sewer rate increase of \$1 per residential unit. (other users increased at the same %). We strive to keep costs as low as possible, but the cost of routine maintenance and unexpected repairs have increased. You can help by not flushing items that may clog or interfere the with function of the system (regardless of what packaging says).
