PENALTY RATE CHANGE

To equalize the liability, the penalty rate for utilities and other city services will be changing from \$5 to 5%, reflective on next month's bill.

REVIEWING YOUR BILLS

Please don't forget to look at your bill. Every effort is made to make sure it's accurate, but we don't always know what customers have going on at their property. For example:

- It is not uncommon for a home to be vacant and show zero usage. If your bill shows 0 usage and you are living there you might want to give us a call and have us check your meter to avoid a large bill when it does report a read.
- It is also not uncommon, especially in the summer, for yard enthusiasts to use 100K+ gallons per month. If your bill shows usage and you are not there, you might want to have someone check it out, you could have an ugly leak!
