WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

- Please use caution around plows. They are big, heavy and require a lot of space to maneuver and extra time to stop. Please stay back and give them plenty of room to work.
- Know you and your vehicle's limits.
- Be alert and allow extra travel time.
- Business owners and homeowners are responsible for clearing sidewalks, parking, and drives.
- It is also good to know that it is best to shovel driveways to the sides. Anything pushed into the street is likely to end up back in the driveway or sidewalk when a plow comes by.

PREVENT PIPES FROM FREEZING

- Keep garage doors closed if there are water supply lines in the garage.
- Open kitchen and bathroom cabinet doors to allow warmer air to circulate around the plumbing. Be sure to move any harmful cleaners and household chemicals up out of the reach of children and pets.
- When the weather is very cold outside, let the cold water drip from the faucet served by exposed pipes. Running water through the pipe - even at a trickle - helps prevent pipes from freezing.
- Keep the thermostat set to the same temperature both during the day and at night. By temporarily suspending the use of lower nighttime temperatures, you may incur a higher heating bill, but you can prevent a much more costly repair job if pipes freeze and burst.
- If you will be going away during cold weather, leave the heat on in your home, set to a temperature no lower than 55° F.
- On a side note: for continued flow, it is also crucial to pay your water bill! ☺
