





WINTER PARKING

Reminder that to allow for snow removal, parking is NOT allowed on the City streets or paved right-of-ways November 1st through March 31st.



WINTER WEATHER REMINDERS

- Please use caution around plows. They are big and heavy and require lots of space to maneuver and extra time to stop. Please stay back and give them plenty of room to do their job.
- Know you and your vehicle's limits.
- Be alert and allow extra travel time.
- Business Owners and homeowners are responsible for clearing sidewalks, parking, and drives.
- It is also good to know that it is best to shovel driveways to the sides. Anything pushed into the street is likely to end up back in the driveway or sidewalk when a plow comes by.

DID YOU KNOW...

The landfill charge on the Utility Bill is for Millard County Landfill use. Delta City acts as a third party biller for them, just as other utility providers do in unincorporated areas of the County. For questions or concerns on this portion of the bill, contact Millard County at 435-864-1400.

BUSINESS LICENSE RENEWALS

Business licenses expired December 31st. If you forgot to renew, please contact the City Office as soon as possible.

ANIMAL LICENSE RENEWALS

Watch for your animal license renewals in the mail next week. Dogs over 6 months of age are required to be licensed. Proof of current rabies vaccinations are required. The annual fee is \$15, \$10 for an altered animal. A kennel license is required for 3 or more dogs.

PREVENT PIPES FROM FREEZING

- Keep garage doors closed if there are water supply lines in the garage.
- Open kitchen and bathroom cabinet doors to allow warmer air to circulate around the plumbing. Be sure to move any harmful cleaners and household chemicals up out of the reach of children and pets.
- When the weather is very cold outside, let the cold water drip from the faucet served by exposed pipes. Running water through the pipe - even at a trickle - helps prevent pipes from freezing.
- Keep the thermostat set to the same temperature both during the day and at night. By temporarily suspending the use of lower nighttime temperatures, you may incur a higher heating bill, but you can prevent a much more costly repair job if pipes freeze and burst.
- If you will be going away during cold weather, leave the heat on in your home, set to a temperature no lower than 55° F.
- On a side note: for continued flow, it is also crucial to pay your water bill☺
