Mayor Dafoe called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Dorothy Jeffery, City Recorder, acted as secretary. Mayor Dafoe stated that notice of the meeting time, place and agenda was posted at the principal office of the governing body located at 76 North 200 West and was provided to the Millard County Chronicle/Progress, the local radio station, KNAK, and to each member of the City Council by personal delivery two days prior to the meeting.

Mayor Dafoe stated that the purpose of the Public Hearing was to receive public comment regarding a request from the Millard School District that certain streets; namely 100 North from 100 East to 150 East and 100 East from a point parallel to Alfred Lake's north property boundary line as it now exists to a point parallel to Lola Farnsworth's south property boundary line as it now exists, be vacated to allow for the proposed construction of a new Delta North Elementary School.

Mayor Dafoe asked for comments from the public.

Superintendent Kenneth Topham addressed the Council and said that the Millard School District has changed their initial proposal. He explained that the revised plans would not require the closing of 100 North Street but would require that a portion of 100 East Street be closed.

Superintendent Topham said that 100 North Street should remain open due to the existence of a storm drain on that street. He said that


he also feels that Velma Timm and Amy Wright should remain in their homes, which are located on 100 North.


The majority of the people who voiced their opinions, spoke in favor of closing the street in order to keep the new school at the present location, which they feel would reduce traffic congestion from other areas with the City and would be a safer setting for the younger children away from the larger schools.

Allen Wardle, Contel, expressed concerns regarding the rerouting of telephone cable that is at that location. He also recommended that other closed streets within the City be reopened for traffic.

Tom and Barbara Callister voiced opposition to the closure of 100 East Street because of traffic access to Main Street and to Delta High School sports events.

Mayor Dafoe asked if there were any comments, questions or items to be discussed. There being none, Mayor Dafoe declared the meeting adjourned at 7:25 p.m.
