Mayor Bunker called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. He stated that notice of the meeting time, place and agenda had been provided to the Millard County Chronicle/Progress and to each member of the City Council at least two days prior to the meeting. City Recorder Gregory Schafer acted as secretary.

The purpose of the public meeting was to receive public input regarding proposed walking and biking trails within Delta City and the surrounding area. Mayor Bunker asked those in attendance for their comments.

Crisanne Black called attention to the map which had been distributed showing proposed walking and biking trails in the area. She discussed the proposed trails outlined on the map and the options provided to allow for either longer or shorter walks and different levels of activity. Council Members and those in attendance reviewed the proposed trails and other ideas for trail design.

Ms. Black asked what the next step would be in going forward with obtaining grant funds for the

proposed walking / biking trails. Council Member Bloomfield indicated that the next step would be making a decision on the exact routes for the trails and the cost of construction so that final cost estimates can be included in the grant application.

Steve Walker stated that he rides a bicycle and has done so on many of the biking trails around the state. He suggested that there be an ordinance to impose traffic restrictions along the trails, for both vehicles and bicycles, in order to allow law enforcement to control safety issues. Mr. Walker felt that this is a great idea and will be a wonderful addition to Delta City but cautioned that there may be some ordinances which need to be put into place as the trails become ready for use.

All individuals in attendance at the meeting spoke in favor of providing walking and biking trails in and around Delta City. There were no negative comments received.

Mayor Bunker declared the public meeting adjourned at 6:52 p.m.
